

EU FAMILIES AND THEIR CHILDREN IN BREXITING BRITAIN | INFORMATION SHEET

EU families and their children in Brexiting Britain: renegotiating inclusion, citizenship and belonging (www.eurochildren.info) is a study funded by the Economic and Social Research Council and is part of *The UK in a changing Europe* initiative. A key part of this research is gaining the perspectives and experiences of EU families and their children in light of the vote to leave the European Union. The study is led by Dr Nando Sigona, University of Birmingham.

Overall, the study seeks to enhance understanding of: a) the experiences and responses of EU families in the aftermath of the vote to leave the EU; b) the impact of political and legal uncertainty on EU families; c) the role and experiences of UK-born children of EU parents in decision making and planning for the future; and d) how UK-born children of EU parents conceptualise their identity and belonging in light of the Brexit process.

We will be putting together a report based on what we discuss here today but we will not use your real names anywhere in the report. Your information will remain confidential and full transcriptions will only be accessible to team members.

The project has received ethics approval by the University of Birmingham Central Research Ethics Committee (CUREC).
